The three courses at Gullane are all a unique challenge, Old Tom Morris designed Luffness New and Kilspindie enjoys stunning views of the Firth of Forth across to Fife and Edinburgh. Newcomers on the coast include Archerfield Links and Craigielaw, and they sit beautifully alongside the region's stalwarts including Royal Musselburgh and the Glen.

With all 21 golf courses within 30 minutes of each other and the furthest course only 50 minutes from Edinburgh and Edinburgh airport, Scotland's Golf Coast is the perfect golf destination. The dry coastal conditions and firm soil allow golf to be played 365 days a year, whilst in the summer, it is light from sunrise at 04.30 to sunset at 22.00.

With the game's history in abundance for the golf aficionados and plenty to do for the non-golfer, East Lothian ticks all the boxes for the golf trip. The towns of Aberlady, Gullane, North Berwick and Dunbar offer atmospheric and welcoming hostelries and Scotland's Food and Drink County can confidently boast about the quality of its produce.
